

The Rev'd Claire Browes - 23 Oct (wk3) - Harvest

Claire is Assistant Curate in Cowley St John Parish—three churches on and around the Cowley Road. She studied Biology in Oxford before training for ordination at Ripon College Cuddesdon.

The Rev'd Professor John Swinton - 30 Oct (wk4)

John Swinton is Professor in Practical Theology and Pastoral Care and Chair in Divinity and Religious Studies and Master of Christ's College at the University of Aberdeen. In 2004, he founded the University of Aberdeen's Centre for Spirituality, Health and Disability. He has published widely within the area of mental health, dementia, disability theology, spirituality and healthcare, qualitative research and pastoral care.





The Rev'd Jonathan Aitkin - 13 Nov (wk6) - Remembrance

Jonathan Aitken is a former Member of Parliament, Cabinet Minister, and exprisoner. After his release he studied Theology at Wycliffe Hall Oxford. In June 2018 he was ordained at St Paul's Cathedral and is now a part time Prison Chaplain at HMP Pentonville and Assistant Priest. Jonathan is the author of nineteen books. He is a well-known broadcaster, journalist and speaker.
