Week 6 (28 May) - Choral **Eucharist for Pentecost.** Guest preacher: Ali Angus. Ali is a community missionary in South London. Her work includes teaching, storytelling, and eco-spirituality.



Week 7 (4 June) - Choral Evensong with **University Sermon.** Preacher: The Rev'd Jarel Robinson-Brown, preaching on 'Naming God: Relationship, Equality, Participation, and Difference'. Fr Jarel is a curate in London, co-chair of OneBodyOneFaith, an author, and scholar of early Christian History.
