

## Rev'd Dr Kirsty Borthwick - 21 Jan (Week of prayer for Christian Unity)

Kirsty is a curate in Leighton Buzzard, in the Diocese of St Albans. She has a PhD on trinitarian theologies of prayer and recently studied with the World Council of Churches at Bossey in Switzerland. Alongside day-to-day parish ministry, she works as a theological educator and ecumenist.

#### The Rev'd Dr Charlie Bell - 11 Feb (wk 5)

Charlie is a priest and a psychiatrist. He is Assistant Professor at Girton College, Cambridge and a Registrar in Forensic Psychiatry at a medium security inpatient unit in South London. He ministers in South London and has published in both medicine and theology, his research interests are culpability, sexuality and doctrine.





#### Pete Dockrill - 18 Feb (wk 6)

Pete is a doctoral student at the Centre for Integrative Systems Biology and Bioinformatics at Imperial College London. Prior to this he was a lay clerk in the choir of Kings College Cambridge, and latterly our own chapel choir.

#### Dr Karen O'Donnell—25 Feb (wk 7)

Karen is the Academic Dean at Westcott House, Cambridge. She lectures in liturgical theology, trauma theology, and feminist theology. Her most recent publications include The DarkWomb: Re-Conceiving Theology Through Reproductive Loss (SCM Press, 2022) and is currently research spiritual practices for trauma survivors.
